Why are they Bad? - Nestlé

In 1992, Pakistan limited the sale of breastmilk substitutes by adding them to a list of products that could only be sold at pharmacies. They were removed from the list three months later, following complaints from the baby food industries and a visit by a senior Nestlé executive.

Nestlé has now succeeded in having the draft law amended so that an industry representative is to sit on the National Infant Feeding Board, which will have responsibility for overseeing the law. Until recently the draft law barred from the board anyone with a vested interest in the infant formula / baby food industry.

For one and a half hours Benjamin entertained a packed house. He seemed relaxed, made use of all the 'stage' and communicated to the audience warmth and candour. He told us about his grandmain Jamaica and the bartering way of life there, which had inspired the work "Need" - a dig at the material world and a discourse on the death of Joy Gardner in police custody, led to "The Death of Joy Gardner" very moving and, as with all his pieces, thought provoking.

"How many vegans in the audience?" brought forth a resounding "Here!" from just one side of the stage, then "How many vegetarians in the audience?" brought forth scattered "Heres" - you vegans really stick together - it sounded impressive.

More audience participation was called for at one point and his well known "Be kind to your turkey this Christmas" poem/message will have, hopefully, got through to more than a few people that night.

I for one enjoyed every minute of the evening and prolonged applause brought Benjamin back for an encore.

By the way, hoping to aid my memory by confirming the titles of some of his pieces, I went to Hull Central Library - no help there!
