## **GM** Food Update

I have been sent quite a bit of literature by the Government on GM foods and their current position. I will issue a full report on the contents when I have thoroughly read them but so far the Government stance seems to be "we are going to conduct thorough tests, listen to everyone, take no risks and then approve them anyway!"

Panorama had a programme recently which talked to those involved and showed you how the approval process works. What was apparent was that the Government committees stick rigorously to their brief (which is good) but any issues outside this brief are assumed to be picked up by another committee. ## Covert Advertising

One of the reasons there were more people at Hitchcocks for the Bob Marley night was a bit of "covert advertising" by ER Vegans. By this I mean everyone can be a vegan even if it is only for one meal and we should encourage people to try even if they are not or have no intention of joining us.

By giving people a taster and demonstrating that we are an inclusive organisation will encourage non-vegans to come again and maybe even try out vegan food at home for the odd occasion.

If we could get everyone in the UK to eat a vegan meal once a month it would effectively mean there being almost **one million extra vegans.** This would have a great impact on food industry economics by reducing the price of vegan items and making the animal industry less profitable which can only be good.
