#### New organic food shop - The Good Life Princess Avenue, Hull

A new organic food shop has opened on Princess Avenue in the premises of what used to be Mississippi's, opposite the Old Zoological pub. It is just getting it self sorted but has a good selection of Suma products plus a range of organic fruit and veg. They also have a chill cabinet.

The shop is open from 10am-6pm Monday through Saturday except Tuesdays if I remember correctly. So its perfect for dropping in during the day or calling in on the way home from work for some fresh organic food. Next time you are in the area pop in and have a browse.

#### Juice Bar in York

Actually this has been there a while but it is a bit tucked away so I thought I would point out that there is a very good juice bar in York called The Juice Place at 28 The Shambles. Open 8am-5pm during the week and slightly shorter hours on weekends it offers many fantastic juices and smoothies including a hot juice that Carol thinks is fantastic. In addition they grow wheat grass and use this in several of their drinks. Well recommended as a pick-me-up after an eventful day!

#### The Fieldgate Centre, Fishlake, nr Doncaster

Is a four acre vegan organic smallholding with a cafe, shop, conference room, caravan site, and bed and breakfast facilities. ## Join Peta for Anti Bullfight Protest in Spain--Running of the Nudes!

July sees the annual running of the bulls event in Pamplona, Spain. This is a particularly cruel ritual that involves an all day torture in various ways of bulls in the name of entertainment. PETA recognise that cultural festivities are a good thing but that animals should not be used so a few years ago they starting a running nude parallel event and they are after volunteers! There will be a bus leaving London to take you to a campsite on 3rd of July returning you on the 7th. The only things you will need to bring are a pillow and a sleeping bag. There will be a vegan barbecue when you arrive at the site and a celebration after the run (actually its more of a fast walk, lasts about 10 minutes and you can where as little or as much as you want). All they ask is that you raise a minimum of £25 in sponsorship to help cover the cost of the trip. # A visit to the Hull Festival of Food & Drink

Hull recently hosted its first food and drink festival and although not a vegan event we decided to visit to see how much they had to offer. We were pleasantly surprised so read on for more about our experiences.

Firstly the number of people who attended was staggering. One of the participants later told us that it was estimated that over 3,000 people had attended on each of the two days. When went on the Sunday and as we left at around 2pm there was a very long queue waiting to get in.

Another aspect that pleased us was the organisation was really good. Plenty of stewards to look after us and show us where to go, well laid out stalls with good access and areas of space to get away from the hustle and bustle.

After a quick walk around all the stalls it was time to take our seats for the **vegetarian cookery demonstration** given by a lecturer from East Riding College. This was a well attended event with probably around 200 watching the demonstration. Two dishes were prepared and cooked before our eyes with many a tip thrown in from the expert while he worked. The first dish was a mushroom parcel starter which would have been vegan apart from the glaze he used but easy to use an alternative. The second dish was a lasagne but instead of pasta he used aubergine slices. This looked very appealing and was a great dish to try for those who want to avoid pasta. Again the dish was vegan apart from some cheese sprinkled on the top, easily avoidable.

After the cooking demonstrations we wondered around the stalls, this time looking in detail at what was on offer. As you can image my attention was quickly drawn to **Splash Wines**, makers of country wines. On questioning the man on the stand who turned out to be the boss we found out that all their wines were OK for us selective types and he was just waiting for the paperwork from the Vegan Society before he could use their logo. After samples of his entire repetoir we customers and looking forward to some nice weather when fruit wines really come into their own.

Another stand that surprised us was **Humdinger Limited**. They sell prunes and make prune juice, fruit bar snacks and dairy-free chocolate. All products were OK for vegans and they are based in Hull. Again I was forced to taste-test things on your behalf and it was another winner especially as the prices were discounted for the show. Their chocolate bars were especially good.

Next stop was the **Black Sheep Brewery** stand. I was informed that their bottles were vegan OK but their draught bitters used inappropriate fining material. Interestingly the bloke on the stand noted that the bottles used a clay based clarifier which is made from shells which are technically an animal product although this process happened many of millions of years before man was on the scene. My philosophy considers this to be OK but it was good to see someone so on the ball. A few tastes but none of these were to my liking. Don't let me put you off though as I am not a big fan of this kind of beverage.

Catherines Choice, makers of relishes, preserves, fruit cheeses, chutneys and the like were also impressive with all their products being vegan. In a similar vein were Raydale Preserves who had a fantastically delicate but tasty rosemary jelly for accompaniment of your roast vegetable dishes. Another impressive stand was Rebori who make food dressings. Not all were vegan but those that were had a great taste. Another Hull based company was Aarhus United. I have tried their tapenades before but they also had brushetta toppings which will shortly be on the shelves. These were very, very nice. Their products are sold under the Chalice brand.

Very noticeable was that all of these companies made great tasting products with few, if any, extras such as preservatives or flavourings in their products. Hopefully these sorts of company will make even greater inroads in the future so that we get more food and less additives on our plates.

We thoroughly enjoyed our few hours at the festival and hope that it will be repeated next year. There are other food festivals around the area in the coming months so why not go to one of them and trumpet the vegan customer demand.
